

**IF YOU ARE PLANNING TO APPLY TO GRADUATE PROGRAMS THIS YEAR
IMPORTANT INFORMATION ON THE GRADUATE RECORD EXAMS**

There are two GRE tests: a General one (required by most graduate programs) and a specific subject test (required by only some programs). If you are applying for financial aid, all application materials including test scores usually have to be in earlier than the regular application deadlines. As you make your application plans, it is VERY IMPORTANT to see which tests are required, because of the registration deadlines for the GRE tests are early this year and the score notifications are later than usual.

REVISED GENERAL TEST

After August 1, the form of the test will be changed. A description of the revised test is available on http://www.ets.org/gre/revised_general/know

Be advised that the mailing dates for test scores are later than usual. Two important pieces of information:

- 1) If you take the revised test between August 1 and September 8, the scores will be available after November 8.
- 2) If you take the revised test between August 1 and September 30, 2011, you will save 50% on the test fees.

PSYCHOLOGY SUBJECT TEST

If the school to which you are applying requires the Psychology subject test, it is ONLY given in paper-based form and is ONLY available three times a year. Because most graduate programs have application deadlines between December and February, you should plan to take the tests in either October or November. If the school requires the subject test and you can not submit your scores by their application deadline, your application will not be considered.
