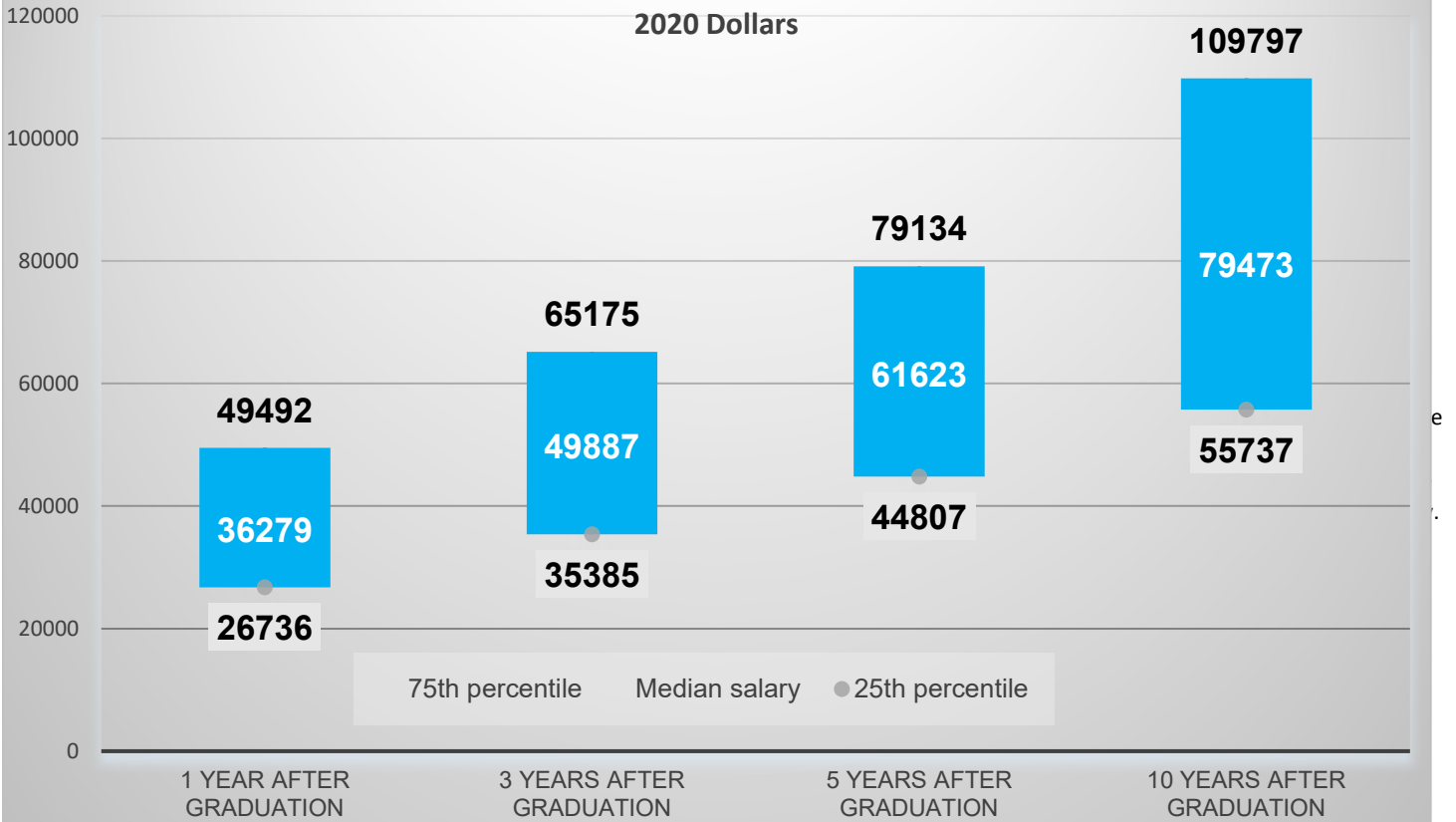

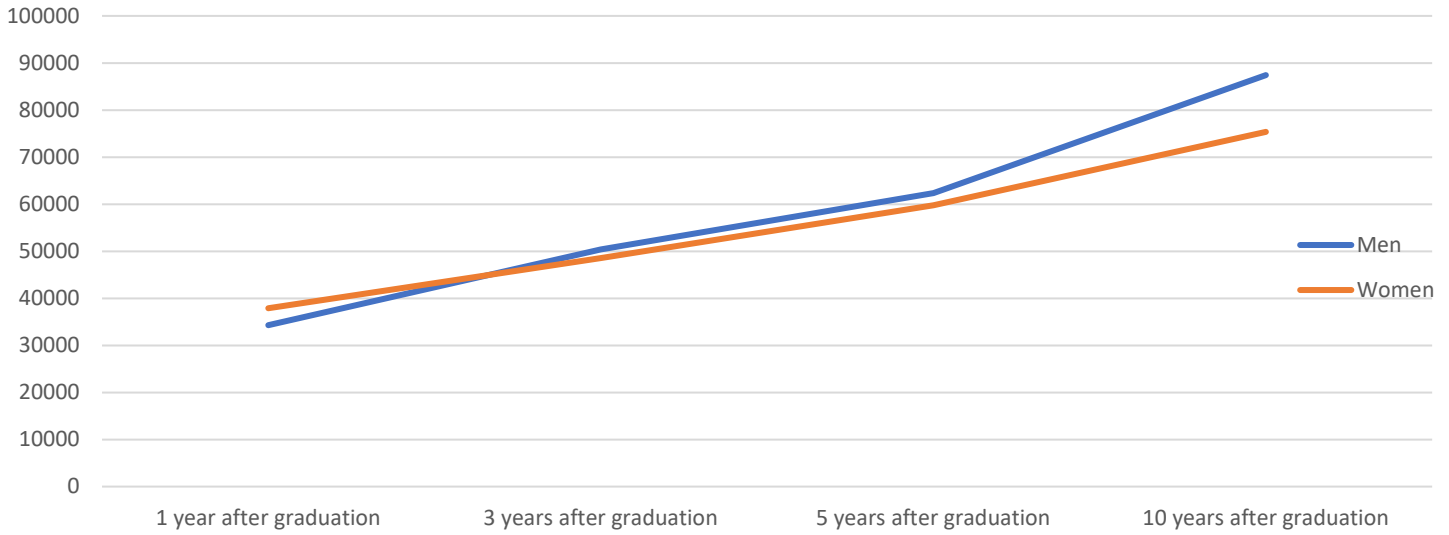

Data are from the New York State Department of Labor database. The table above presents median salaries and the interquartile range for graduates after one year, three years, five years, and ten years for those who work in New York state. Graduates must be employed three out of the four quarters to be included. Federal employees, military employees, and the self-employed are not included. The wages of graduates who enroll for further education are not included during their years of enrollment. The salary results for graduates after one year include the cohorts of 2001-2018; the results for three years include 2001-2016; and results for five and ten years include the cohorts of 2001-2014 and 2001-2009 respectively. The results are pooled (all cohorts considered together) presented in 2020 dollars. These data were assembled by Stephen Sheets, CUNY Central Office of Institutional Research on October 6, 2020. 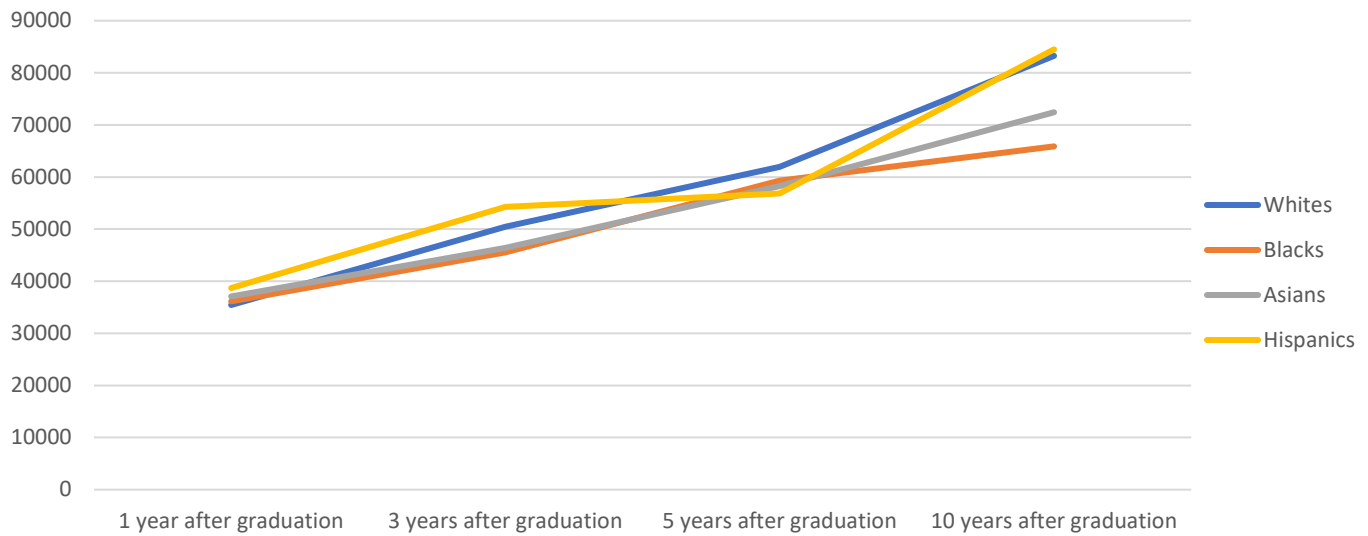
Median Salaries of Queens College Political Science Baccalaureate Graduates 1, 3, 5, & 10 Years After Graduation, by Gender*

The data in the tables on this screen and on the following two screens were drawn from the National Student Clearinghouse by Zhili Liang (Queens College Office of Institutional Effectiveness) on March 18, 2020. They show what percentage of recent Queens College Political Science graduates of 2012-13 through 2015-2016 enrolled to seek further education after graduating. For the Political Science graduates of 2012-2013, about 56% have enrolled in post-baccalaureate programs and 35% have obtained additional credentials. About half of these are law degrees, although there is also a significant number who earned various types of Master's degrees. A very small number chose to enroll for a second BA or in a certificate program. The next two screens show which colleges they chose to attend, and in which fields they earned their degrees.
