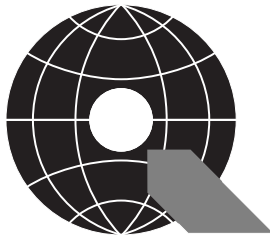

Aboriginal People & Culture

Conducted in English

Key areas of recent anthropological literature will be explored to provide insights into Australian social life, drawing on examples from Indigenous and non-Indigenous contexts, as well as their interaction. With an explicitly cross-cultural focus, students will utilize what they learn about other cultures in order to achieve a deeper, more reflexive comprehension of their experience within Australian society. Topics will include family and kinship; race, ethnicity and violence; cosmology and the rituals and meanings that attach to birth and death. Some short, team-based field exercises will enable students to gain an understanding of how anthropological research is conducted. Excursions will include Lake Condah, part of the Budj Bim National Heritage Landscape in Western Victoria, where the Gunditjmarra people developed a sophisticated local aquaculture economy.

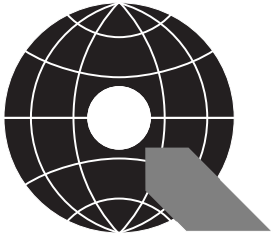

Photography in Florence & Rome

Conducted in English

This is a course in how to “see” photographically. It will not focus on hardware or the darkroom—rather it will be concerned with the visual, intellectual, and intuitive elements that go into making a photograph. Florence and Rome will be the setting against which both beginning and intermediate photographers can improve their photographic techniques. Students will learn how to establish a point of view, develop a personal vision, and edit their pictures into a coherent visual narrative. The goal will be to discover honest documentary images with a high aesthetic value to communicate ideas beyond the obvious or clichéd. Experimentation will be encouraged, and students will be expected to explore and test new ideas, to use a variety of skills in landscape, portraiture, street photography, and intimate pictures of daily life to produce a photo essay on a topic of their choosing. Students may work in any film or with digital cameras, with film processed by a local lab. Each morning students will gather for group and individual critiques; afternoons and evenings will be spent shooting. Weekends will provide an opportunity for students to travel and photograph outlying areas on their own. The course will strike a balance between fieldwork, critiques, new aesthetic material, and the freedom to explore and photograph in Florence and Rome.

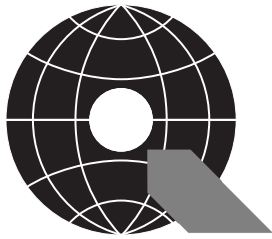

Galileo Game: Reacting to the Past in Florence & Rome

Conducted in English

“Reacting” is an innovative way of learning through role-playing and elaborate games. In this new and exciting “Reacting to the Past” Queens College course we will study the history of the Scientific Revolution by examining the impact of Galileo Galilei’s teachings about the cosmos. We will “react” in the historical moment of Galileo’s trial as new science collided with the elegant cosmology of Aristotle, Aquinas, and medieval Scholasticism. Students will be assigned roles as historical figures during the trial of Galileo in Rome during the years 1616–1633. At the heart of the game is animated discussion and debating about issues in the first decades of the 17th century. Visits to historical sites in Florence and Rome associated with Galileo and his trial.

Cairo, Egypt

Conducted in English and elementary Arabic

Study Arabic at several levels of instruction: (a) Three sequential courses in Arabic at the elementary level; each meets 5 days a week, 4 hours per day, and aims to develop the fundamentals of modern standard Arabic through reading, writing, and oral drill within a framework of the essentials of syntax, morphology, and a working vocabulary. (b) Two introductory courses in colloquial Arabic offer study, by means of phonetic transcription or the Arabic alphabet, of the basic inflectional and syntactical patterns of Egyptian colloquial Arabic; instruction includes 1 hour of language laboratory. (c) Three sequential courses in Arabic at the intermediate level: each course meets 5 hours a week and aims to increase the command of grammatical and syntactical structure of modern standard Arabic through reading materials, and to develop reading and writing skills and comprehension. Day trips to ancient Egyptian and Islamic monuments will be organized as part of the course experience.
