

## Final Oral Presentation Guidelines

The Final Exam for Chinese 101 will include: a joint oral presentation and a written exam. Below are the Guidelines for the final oral presentation:

- Form a dialogue group of 2 or 3 people. Report to me your group members' names by the **Tuesday, 11/12/2019**.
- Create a 5-10 minute dialogue based on the vocabulary and the grammars that we have learned in the semester. This dialogue cannot be identical to any dialogue we have learned in the text book.
- On **11/26**, we will collect your presentation draft, mark it and return it to you. Note that for each dialogue group, you will only need to prepare one copy of the draft. This draft needs to be written or typed in Hanzi or Pinyin (with tone marks).

- You can choose to **present** your dialogue in person on **Tuesday, 12/10/2019**, or you can make a **video recording** of your dialogue presentation and show us on that day. Note that in either mode of the presentation, you **cannot** 'read'. You have to 'act'. This means your will have to memorize (most of) your lines by heart.
